The September calendar was sent out Monday and our second "Tidbits" for the year was sent out Tuesday of this week. We will be sending home this week's Tidbits via a hard copy, this week, only. It will include our traffic pattern and our "Inclement Weather Dismissal" routine.

On Monday, August 30, we received some great news! Roan Forest was one of two schools (the other was Hardy Oak) which were recognized by the Texas Business and Education Coalition, TBEC. The TBEC Honor Roll is the



most prestigious award for sustained academic excellence in Texas. It recognizes schools that have demonstrated three years of consistent, high performance in all subjects compared to other schools serving similar student populations. TBEC Honor Roll schools have the highest percentage of students performing at the state's most rigorous standard-"commended" in every subject. Out of 8,000 Texas schools less than 4% will be honored. We are in that top 4% of schools in Texas. Congratulations go to our teachers, children and families who make our school exemplary!

Finally, we look forward to another exciting year of outstanding performance and creativity. Thank you for your support and care!

Music Notes

The beginning of the school year is always a busy time and that is especially true for the music department. There are several things which take place at the beginning of the year that we want to make sure parents are aware of.

If your child is in the **3rd**, **4th**, **or 5th grade**, they should have brought home two forms after the first week of school. One form has to do with the students in those grades needing a recorder for our music class. For most of our students, the note is just a reminder to bring their recorders to school so that they are ready for our recorder unit. But for some, it is information on how best to get a recorder and what type is needed. This form is also available electronically on our teacher web pages.

Also, your child should have brought home information about our choir and instrument clubs. These programs are an extra chance for students get involved musically at Roan Forest. The choir is open to all 3rd, 4th, and 5th grade students while instrument club is open only to 4th and 5th graders. This form is also available online under our teacher web pages.

Two New Laws Helping to Make Our Children Safer

- Beginning September 1, 2009, a new Texas child passenger safety laws require children requires children under age 8 to ride in a booster seat, unless they are 4'9" tall.
- A new law went into effect September 1st that makes it illegal for drivers to use cell phones without hands-free devices in school zones. The law includes any use of a cell phone, including texting.
